Two Models

The P3, stricto sensu

- Public-Private Partnership
 - Federal Statute 11.079/2004
 - Costs borned exclusively by the users
 - Costs borned partially by the Government
 - Costs borned entirely by the Government
 - Federal Statute 8.987/1995
 - Public permit to explore a public service

The SO Model

- Social Organization
 - Federal Statute 9637/98 (SO)
- SO of Public Interest
 - Federal Statute 9790/90 (SOPI)

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P3 stricto sensu

- Huge projects (infra-structure)
- Long-Term Agreements
- High Costs
- High Risks
- Anticipation of High Profits

SO Model

- Third Sector:
 - NGO
 - Small Companies
 - Co-ops
- Participation of Local Communities
- Local based
- Costs and Risks are monitored by means of a management contract

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Urban Regulation

- The City Statute: 10.257/2001
 - Article 4, III, f: city budget control
 - Article 43, 44, 45: democratic participation
 - The Social Interest of the Citizens
 - The Social Role of Property

 - International Documents
 - Federal Government Ordinance 7307/2009
